Center for Sustainable Landscapes has sustainable job trailer, too

Williams Scotsman's reMOD modular jobsite office is being used as a central point for workers who are part of the 24,000-sf Phipps Conservatory Center for Sustainable Landscapes project in Pittsburgh by Turner Construction as part of a two-phase development project. Construction began in October, 2010 and the project is slated for completion in December, 2011. The project is to achieve LEED Platinum certification plus certification under the Living Building Challenge of the International Living Building Institute. The unit at Phipps Conservatory is a mid

green unit which includes motion sensor light switches, programmable thermostat, GreenGuard certified insulation, automatic hand dryers, recycling areas, fluorescent bulbs, white roofing, low-E windows, tubular daylighting devices, dual flush systems and low-flow faucets. Other options include an eco-minded interior and exterior design and framework. Self-sustaining renewable resource systems maximize energy efficiency in the units. **BXM**

Among the rubble, dirt paths and dump trucks, more than 200 construction workers perform the challenging, yet crucial, services of asbestos abatement and selective demolition at the Cleveland Medical Mart & Convention Center site. About 110 are from Precision Environmental Company, a DiGeronimo Company.
